Ph.D. Admission Test– 2020 (PAT-20)

(As per Regulation approved by the Governor's Secretariat, Bihar
(Vide Memo No. BSU-05/2010/2684/GS (I) dated 21.09.2017)

Application from the candidates having Master's degree with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed, and relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, will be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/EBC/OBC/Differently-abled categories of candidates is invited for Ph.D. Admission Test-2020 (PAT-20) latest by 02-03-2021. The Test is scheduled to be held on 15-04-2021.

Candidates seeking admission to the Ph.D. programme shall have to apply online with requisite fee within the schedules period to the University UMIS website – www.bnmuumis.in

Admission to Ph.D. Programme would ordinarily be held only in those subjects in which Post-Graduate Courses are being offered by the university.

Guidelines for the candidates

Eligibility for Ph.D. Admission Test (PAT) - 20

- (i) Candidates for admission to the Ph.D. programme shall have a Master's degree with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed).
- (ii) A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, will be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/EBC/OBC/Differently-abled categories of candidates.
- (iii) A candidate shall ordinarily be permitted to pursue research for the Ph.D. degree in the subject in which he/she holds Master's degree.

Exemptions from the written test of Ph.D. Admission Test (PAT) – 2020

- (1) Candidates who have secured grants for research such as fellowship/scholarship/Associateship/ etc. by qualifying UGC/NET/CSIR-NET/GATE/MHRDScholarships/TeacherFellowship/DBT/ICMR/ICAR/DST-INSPIRE/CSSIR, ICHR etc. / written test of PAT of the university.
- (2) Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor who have been appointed on substantive post in the UGC pay scale in the teaching departments or the University or a constituent college of the University who have completed their probation successfully with an experience of at least two years of uninterrupted service would be considered under this category. Teachers appointed in self-finance courses will not be exempted from the test.
- (3) Non-teaching employees of the University, who are holding substantive appointment for more than five years having at least 55% marks in Master's degree in the subject concerned, and with at least two research papers published in any reputed refereed journal or journals identified by the UGC would be considered under this category.

Note: *The candidates, who are exempted from PAT 2020, are also required to apply with requisite Fee.*

How to Apply

Duly filled in application may be submitted online to the University Management Information System (UMIS) of B.N.M.U. from **18-02-2021 to 01-03-2021 (Without Fine)** and **02-03-2021 to 06-03-2021 (With Late Fine)** and Portal will be closed at **11:59 PM** on the last date and day of the application. No application will be accepted after the due date. Incomplete application will be rejected.

Procedure for Ph.D. Admission Test-2020 (PAT-20)

The procedure for admission to Ph.D. programme in different departments would be overall governed by the Uniform Ordinance and Regulations governing award of Ph. D. Degree by the universities of Bihar. There would be two streams of applicant (i) Candidates for admission to the Ph.D. programme shall have a Master's degree with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and those exempted from PAT (NET etc.). All such candidates would be pooled together and have to appear before an Interview Board. The

Interview Board shall consist of the members of the Departmental Council along with an External Expert not below the rank of Professor. The final selection of both categories of candidates in the Ph.D. programme would be based on the performance of candidates in the interview as well as on the basis of marks obtained in PAT and NET examination.

Written Test

Written test will be comprised of two papers of 100 marks each.

Paper -I: 100 marks will consist on objective/ multiple choice questions on qualitative teaching and research aptitude.

Paper -II: 100 marks will be subjective type in the subject concerned based on syllabus (excluding elective papers) of the Post-Graduate courses of the B. N. Mandal University, Madhepura, Bihar.

The minimum qualifying marks for written test will be as follows:

For **General** candidates – **50%** aggregate marks

For **Reserved** category candidates – **45%** aggregate marks

Merit List

The subject wise merit list will be prepared on a scale of 100 including marks in Master Degree; weightage on PAT/NET/BET/JRF and Interview as mentioned in the following Table i.e. maximum weightage on marks obtained in Master's Degree Programme as 70, plus maximum weighting on PAT/NET/JRF as 10, plus Interview of 20 marks.

Candidates will be selected following the prescribed reservation rules of Bihar Government.

The selection of the candidate will be on the basis of marks obtained in Written Test and Merit List including Interview combined together as mentioned above the Table.

Instructions to the candidates

Paper I – Multiple choice questions (MCQ).

No. of Questions – 50 Full Marks: $2 \times 50 = 100$

Duration of examination: **1 hour**

There will be no negative marking.

Students are not allowed to take out the questions booklets of Paper I.

Paper II – Essay Type/Subjective,

Duration of Examination: **2 Hours**. Full Marks: **=100**

Test will be based on the syllabus (excluding elective papers) of the Post-Graduate Degree Courses of B. N. Mandal University.

Availability of Admission Card

PAT-20 Admission Card will be uploaded on the UMIS portal on 10-04-2021. The copy of the Admit Card must be attested by the Head of the Departments/Principal of the constituent colleges last attended or by a Gazette Officer. It is necessary for the candidates to attest their photographs, signature and put thumb impression on the admit card to appear the examination.

General information to the candidates

Shield Coding Answer book will be provided to the candidates in the examination hall 15 minutes before the start time of the examination and they will have not unshielded the answer book until and unless start single has not been given by the invigilator. If candidates unshielded the answer book prior to start of the examination they may be expelled from the Test.

The successful result of Ph.D. Admission Test (PAT) will be valid for three years from the date of declaration/publication of the result. The PAT will be under the preview of the Rule of RTI Act, 2005.

Test Centre

Test will be held at Madhepura centers and it will be communicated/ announced properly in time.

Syllabus of PAT-2020

Syllabus of **Paper I** of PAT will be as follows:-

Paper-I: General and Research Aptitude Test.

All questions with multiple choices, each correct answer carries 2 Marks. There will be Full Marks: 100, Total number of Questions: 50 and no negative marking. Duration of Exam will be of 1 Hour.

There will be 7 Parts in the paper. The distribution of marks and number of questions are given in the table below:-

Paper II Test will be based on the syllabus (excluding elective papers) of the Post- Graduate Degree Courses of B. N. Mandal University.

FINAL SELECTION

The final selection of candidates in the Ph.D. Programme would be based on the performance of all the candidates (coming through PAT or exempted category of candidate).

The final selection list would be displayed on the UMIS Portal of B. N. Mandal University Website www.bnmuumis.in as well as on the concerned Departmental Notice Board only. The result should be checked by the candidate from the personal login account. It is expected that result will be announced by the first week of May, 2021. The result will be published in terms of overall merit-rank and category rank obtained by the candidate.
